Growing food for ministry in Sierra Leone



LiIVES are being transformed in **Sierra Leon**e through Scripture Union ministry. In the last few years the work has spread to reach all 16 districts of the country, including many areas where the population is predominantly of another faith.

The team of dedicated staff and volunteers remain committed to engaging with children and young people with the gospel message, values education and lifeskills for holistic transformation. They hope to reach out further into more remote areas by travelling on motorcycles to villages and communities and are praying for further resources for motorbikes.

Their work with children is also being supported by Scripture Union Sierra Leone's agricultural site, where they are growing potatoes, maize and pineapples, to fund the ministry.

SU Sierra Leone's National Director, Kpandei Tucker, said: "We have a challenge with certain insects that are attacking the maize/corn and we will need to spray the entire

400 ridges. As we continue to trust God for provision, we hope to increase planting of pineapples to 1,000 suckers. Kindly keep praying for this project."

As they look to the future, their hope is to be able to develop a campsite on their 18 acre plot of land about 40 km away from the capital city of Freetown.

THIS west African country remains a land of suffering. The people are still mired in desperate poverty, most surviving on less than a dollar a day. It has ranked as the world's poorest country for most of the last 10 years. With the highest infant and maternal mortality rates in the world and widespread disease (malaria, HIV, others), life expectancy is only 47 and is not rising. Much work remains to ease the suffering of these who have already endured so much.

We thank God for the end of 11 years of chaos that claimed up to 100,000 lives, crippled many thousands, and harmed most of the population in some way. The Ebola crisis of 2014-2015 set back nation-building progress significantly and Christian agencies are working to rebuild the country and minister to spiritual, physical, and psychological needs.

Young people's ministry in Sierra Leone has never been more crucial and needs to be

expanded. Scripture Union is working in schools and universities and we pray that Christian graduates may decisively impact the nation. Beyond student ministry, many children remain in difficult situations.
